NEW CDC FACE COVERINGS GUIDELINES

- Use simple cloth face coverings to slow the spread of virus.
- These coverings can be fashioned from household items or made at home & used as a voluntary public health measure.
- Wear when social distancing measures are difficult to maintain, such as the grocery stores, and pharmacies.
- Should **NOT** be placed on children under 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, is unconscious, incapacitated or unable to remove the mask without assistance?
- These recommended cloth face coverings are NOT surgical masks or N95 respirators.

Governor Pritzker extends the “Stay At Home “ order through the end of April.

If you have symptoms of respiratory illness such as fever, cough, shortness of breath, **stay home and call your doctor.** Distance yourself from others in the household and if possible, stay in your own bedroom and use your own bathroom. Seek medical care right away if your illness is worsening (for example, you have difficulty breathing).

DO NOT walk into a healthcare facility, urgent care clinic, or hospital before calling.

Call 911 if you are having a medical emergency & alert dispatch if you have respiratory symptoms.
